# San Jacinto College-South Associate Degree in Nursing (TWU ADN/BS Nursing Transfer Plan) And Texas Woman's University Bachelor of Science - Nursing Major

This is a guaranteed course transfer agreement to Texas Woman's University for students who wish to complete or have already completed the Associate Degree in Nursing at the San Jacinto College South and then transfer to TWU to achieve the Bachelor of Science Degree with a major in nursing. This agreement is also for students who have an active Texas registered nursing license and who desire to take the academic prerequisites at the San Jacinto College South in order to enter the baccalaureate nursing program at Texas Woman's Universitty. With an active Texas RN license and in fulfilling TWU's prerequisites for the B.S. degree, this plan will also give the student an Associate of Arts from San Jacinto College South. TWU will transfer a maximum of 72 hours from the San Jacinto College South. The following courses to be taken through the San Jacinto College South will apply both to the A.A. degree and the B.S. degree unless otherwise indicated:

- \*\* Associate degree requirements at San Jacinto College-South, including the minimum allowed grade point average, are found in the San Jacinto College-South catalog in effect during the student's initial semester of continuous enrollment. See counselor for more information.
- a ENGL 1301, 1302; PSYC 2301, 2314; BIOL 2401, 2402, should have already been completed through an ADN program and will count toward TWU's nursing prerequisites. (Note: a minimum grade of C is required in BIOL 2401, 2402, and 2420).
- b May choose any sophomore level English literature course.
- c This course fulfills San Jacinto College-South associate degree sophomore literature requirements as well as TWU's Women's studies requirement.
- d May choose from PHIL 1311 or PHIL 1312 Introduction to Philosophy.
- e Choose from ARTS 1303, 1304; DANC 2303; DRAM 2361; MUSI 1308, or 1309. (Note: Also fulfills one of TWU's two Interdisciplinary course requirement.)
- f Choose from ANTH 2351, ENGL 2336, or PSYC 2370. (Note: Also fulfills TWU's Interdisciplinary requirement.)

Application must be made to the TWU Undergraduate Admission Office and the TWU College of Nursing office by the appropriate deadlines. With the above academic prerequisites completed with a 2.0 GPA, with a minimum grade of C in microbiology and anatomy & physiology, with an active Texas Registered Nursing license, and with acceptance to Texas Woman's University granted, a student is given automatic admission to the TWU upper division of the Collge of Nursing

Once admission to the College of Nursing is granted, TWU will grant 25 semester hours competency credit for an active Texas RN license. Credit is awarded for the following courses.

#### Conditions of Student Transfer Contract

- 1. This agreement applies to the Texas Woman's University catalog beginning 1997-1999. That is if a student completes the lower level prerequisites with a minimum 2.0 GPA, attains a minimum grade of C in microbiology and anatomy & physiology, and transfers to Texas Woman's University within two years of prerequisite completion, the student is eligible for this published articulation agreement. The lower level courses will transfer to TWU and count fully toward the Bachelor of Science Degree with major in nursing requirements, if admitted to this program.
- 2. This agreement gives automatic acceptance to the upper division of the TWU College of Nursing, if a student is practicing with an active Texas RN license, completes all lower division prerequisites at the appropriate GPA levels, and is admitted to the university. However, commencement of the upper division program in the TWU College of Nursing is on a space-available basis. That is, a student is given automatic acceptance to the TWU College of Nursing at the time of application. However, if immediate space is not available for the term the student wishes to begin the TWU upper level nursing courses, he/she will be given priority entrance the following term.
- 3. This agreement means that the above San Jacinto College-South courses will transfer and that the Texas Woman's University B.S. with a major in nursing prerequisite requirements will not change for a San Jacinto College South student who transfers to TWU within two years of prerequisite completion. Only the courses on the current TWU ADN/BS Nursing Transfer Plan qualify for a student contract.
- 4. Written notification by TWU to San Jacinto College-South of prerequisite or program changes will automatically revise that portion of the San Jacinto College-South/TWU ADN/BS Nursing Transfer Plan without further action, and no further signatures will be necessary to effectuate the change. Thus this articulation agreement will be assumed to be current through revisions of the TWU ADN/BS Nursing Transfer Plan.

This agreement shall be effective beginning Fall Semester, 1998, and shall continue thereafter until terminated by either party with 90 days written notice to the other party. Those students already participating in the contract at the time of termination will have their course work honored.
